- Emergency medical evacuation cover (all guests must have their own travel and health insurance).




# THE OKAVANGO DELTA

#### **Moremi Crossings**

As you fly from the Central Kalahari over the Okavango Delta you can see the intricate twisting and turning of the waterways and the everchanging colours where dry land meets Delta.

Located near the most southern part of Chief's Island, Moremi Crossing is situated on a small palm fringed and treed island called Ntswi which is surrounded by the Moremi's game-rich seasonal floodplains.







#### THE AREA

Since this area normally receives floods last it contains some of the closest dry season watering points for the game that spreads out towards Nxai and Makgadikgadi Pans during the rains. Around this, there is a high density of game in the dry season but since quite a lot of the reserve is mopane woodlands (a favourite location for animals during the rains and early dry season) good game viewing is expected all year round.

This river system attracts a wide variety of game. Familiar favourites include Elephant, Buffalo, Giraffe, Kudu, Impala, Tsessebe, Hippo, Crocodile, Genet, Honey Badger and a host of Plains Game. Rare Antelope breeds including Roan, Sable & Eland, not normally seen in the Okavango region, occur here. As the Gomoti is the main water source in the area, Lion, Leopard, Cheetah and Wild Dog come down to the riverside to drink and hunt, of course!

The locations and views are spectacular with the classic flooding of the Okavango across the adjacent seasonal floodplains. For those keen on birdwatching, the combination of the wetlands and the drier Acacia and Mopane veldt provide a perfect habitat for a variety of aquatic species including Open Billed Storks, Hammerkops, Egrets, Ibis and forest/savannah dwellers including Raptors, Shrikes, Drongos, Sunbirds, Ground Hornbills and so on.









## ABOUT MOREMI CROSSINGS

In contrast to the northern Okavango Delta where the waters are fast-flowing and the channels and view is enclosed by high reeds and papyrus, the channels around Moremi Crossing offer far reaching vistas of the Moremi's floodplain, grasslands and marginal woodlands interspersed with Mokolwane palm islands.

The central dining area houses a large open plan deck that has spectacular views over the Boro River onto Chief's Island. This half-moon shaped area is built on different levels to give a spacious feel. The dining room, bar and lounge is covered by a large, thatched roof that hugs the ancient riverene tree line. The whole camp is shaded by magnificent Llala Palms, Giant Ebony, Mangosteen, Sausage and Giant Fig trees.



## **ACCOMMODATION**

Accommodation consists of 16 en-suite and spacious tents on raised decks, each with their own veranda overlooking Chief's Island. Tents have their own eco-friendly outdoor shower heated by solar power. We have both a Family Tent sleeping four (2 adults and 2 children) and a Honeymoon Tent with an outdoor bath.



Another great way to explore the crystal-clear channels of the Boro River is by motorboat. Watch the sun set while drifting along a lagoon and sipping on sundowners. For the adventurous, we also offer a rustic island camping experience



## **MMA DINARE**

Another chartered flight will take you to a whole new area of the Okavango. Set in a private 272 km2 concession, adjacent to Moremi Game reserve on the south-eastern side of the Delta. Mma Dinare overlooks the Gomoti River and its flood plains, and the camp has been designed to embrace the natural surroundings. This is a 100% eco-friendly development, featuring the latest in solar and waste technology.





#### THE AREA

Since this area normally receives floods last it contains some of the closest dry season watering points for the game that spreads out towards Nxai and Makgadikgadi Pans during the rains. Both central areas have been built in keeping with our other properties - open, thatched spaces that allow guests to relax and enjoy the natural surroundings, whilst watching wildlife and birds from the comfort of an armchair or the bar. The swimming pool and curio shop at each camp complete the luxurious, relaxed feel for which these safaris are known.

As Mma Dinare is in a private concession you have the opportunity to drive off road in search of sightings and also it means the ability to drive at night with spotlights. The mokoro trip is the quintessential delta experience. There is nothing more relaxing than poling along the lagoon and channels with your guide, soaking up the atmosphere and seeing things from a totally different perspective. The mokoro trip is offered seasonally when water levels allow.








## **ACCOMMODATION**

Each standard tent is identical in footprint with en-suite bathroom and shower, suitable for twin beds or one double bed.






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


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## POM POM

Another chartered flight will take you deeper than ever into the Okavango.

Built and designed in the style of safari camps of old, This is a camp for the safari traditionalist. In the main thatched building you will find a cozy bar, lounge and table settings for imaginative meals prepared by our safari chefs. Our camp staff are proficient at their skills and will give you advice, suggestions and help during your stay. They will also give you a warm welcome at the end of each day. Pom Pom is known as much for its "soul" as for the game and wildlife in the area.







#### THE AREA

On an island in the heart of the Okavango Delta, this camp is set on the tree line overlooking the Pom Pom Lagoon from which it takes it's name. Yet another jewel in Botswana's crown. Here, hippo grunt and frolic in front of camp's lagoon that is surrounded by miles of reeds.

A private concession on the head waters of the Xudum River system and on the western boundary of the Moremi Game Reserve, creates for not only some superb Okavango scenery, but also consistent wildlife throughout the year. A true experience for those who love Africa.

Pom Pom Camp is an eco-friendly camp located on Pom Pom Island in a private concession in the heart of the Okavango Delta and on the head waters of the Xudum river system.

The area lies on the western boundary of the Moremi Game Reserve and not only offers superb Okavango scenery but also consistent game viewing all year round. Pom Pom is the real deal for those who live & breath Africa.





## ACCOMMODATION


Pom Pom Camp consists of nine large walk-in luxury safari tents in true traditional safari style, furnished with en-suite, semi-open ablutions. Although roofless, the bathrooms are enclosed for security, privacy and of course - a unique safari experience. The tents are uniquely positioned under the shade of the surrounding trees that overlook the Pom Pom lagoon. The family safari tent, which is close to the main lodge, accommodates four (two adults and two children), with en-suite facilities.




















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Morning and evening game drives with our qualified guides are an opportunity to view the 'big game' and night life that this breath-taking environment can offer. As Pom Pom is in a private concession we have the opportunity to drive off road in search of sightings and also it means we are able to drive at night with spotlights.

Game drives are operated with both a guide and tracker. This adds to your experience with two sets of eyes searching for wildlife, ensuring a much better chance of sightings. Having a tracker also gives the guide more ability to talk to guests and answer any questions on the area or animals.


A mokoro trip is a fantastic way to enjoy the sights and sounds of the Okavango's waterways and wildlife. Although seasonal, boating and fishing are possible at Pom Pom and our guides will be happy to take you to their secret spots to try for African pike and a variety of bream species. Mokoros, boat cruises & fishing are water level dependent.

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


e are happy to be able to offer, at an additional cost, a guaranteed heli/mokoro excursion from Pom Pom Camp. This epic adventure combines the thrill of a spectacular helicopter ride above the wilds of the Okavango with the serenity of the Delta's most iconic activity, a mokoro safari.


Departing at dawn, the trusty pilot from Helicopter Horizons will whisk you across the waking animal world of Botswana's UNESCO World Heritage Site. After a fifteen-minute flight, the chopper lands on the southern fringes of the wetland. Out here, there's always water and coming down from sky-high beginnings, you'll then experience the Okavango Delta in detail accompanied by a poler in Daonara. But first, coffee! Tucked under the pilot seat, a secret flask of coffee reveals itself. Your Motswana poler will glide the craft gently past waterlily pads, upon which African Jacanas lightly tread. They expertly (and safely) skirt the distant hippo pods, spot Openbill Storks strutting their stuff and if you're lucky, perhaps even seek out an elephant crunching on the river reeds. Two blissful hours are over in a flash and before you know it, you're heading back to the helicopter.







Luckily, the fun isn't over. Now that the sun's out, animals spread out below in their massive congregations. Keep your eyes peeled for buffalo hoardes, look out for elephant gatherings and seek out Red lechwe as they leap across the serpentine channels. It's another fifteen-minute flight back to camp, enjoy every second.
