WHAT'S INCLUDED:

- All transfers between camps/lodges Starting and ending in Maun. We personally meet all our guests at Maun Airport.
- Accommodation with all meals and beverages, (alcoholic and non-alcoholic) as well as daily laundry. Alcoholic beverages comprise of South African wines and spirits.
- All game-viewing activities that are possible at that camp during that season.
- Emergency medical evacuation cover (all guests must have their own travel and health insurance).





THE AREA

Located in an exclusive and private concession in the northern Okavango Delta, Kwara Camp offers the ultimate Delta experience. With Access to the permanent labyrinth of waterways and an expansive dry area that boasts one of the best wildlife areas in the Okavango.

Kwara is known for not just its consistent sightings of predators, including lions, cheetah, leopard but also on occasion the rare white rhino has been seen. Herds of elephants also frequent the area, as well as giraffe, zebra, sitatunga, lechwe, impala and hippos.



ABOUT KWARA

The main area of the camp, sits in the centre of the camp, has a dining area, lounge and curio shop. Kwara also has 2 small pool areas at each end of the camp providing guests with more private lounge areas. Each poolside has a small bar and pool loungers for guests to enjoy the afternoon siesta period.

reopened in 2019 with a whole new setting and extensive rebuild, the luxury camp sits under a shade of tall trees and has a view overlooking the floodplains and nearby lagoon. With nine rooms, the camp also boasts two pool areas on each side of the camp. This allows for guests to spread out and enjoy more privacy between activities and relax in all the comfort that Kwara provides.





ACCOMMODATION

The décor of Kwara pays homage to the authentic African style and has 9 canvas tents. Each tent has a spacious deck overlooking the lagoon, an ensuite bathroom with both indoor and outdoor showers and a gorgeous bath – all of which have views out to the floodplains. There is a ceiling fan in the room and mosquito nets around the beds.

Bed Sizes: As a double it would be Super-king, extra length and as a twin it would be two $\frac{3}{4}$ beds, extra length Flasks of drinking water are available In-room USB charging for cameras (hair-dryers are not possible due to the voltage consumed) Alternators possible for sleep apnea machines





Game drives are operated using a guide and tracker, this adds to the experience on two levels. You have two sets of eyes searching out the action, looking for tracks – this ensures a good chance of sightings, especially predators. In addition, having the tracker out front, concentrating on tracking, means that the guide is more able to talk to guests, keep them informed and answer all their questions, it leads to a more relaxed, convivial game drive atmosphere. As Kwara is in a private concession we have the opportunity to drive off road in search of sightings and also it means we are able to drive at night with spotlights.

ACTIVITIES

Fishing is also offered at Kwara for 10 months of the year but is prohibited in January and February as this is peak breeding season. Basic equipment is supplied, but avid fly-fishers are advised to bring their own equipment.

The mokoro trip is the quintessential delta experience. There is nothing more relaxing than poling along the lagoon and channels with your guide, soaking up the atmosphere and seeing things from a totally different perspective.

There is a double deck boat available to go out for a short sunset cruises, the perfect way to spend an afternoon, meandering the waterways.

ACTIVITIES

Kwara is known for its consistent sightings of predators, including lion, cheetah, leopard and on rare occasion – white rhino! Herds of elephants also frequent the area, as well as giraffe, zebra, sitatunga, lechwe, impala and hippos

In the months of October to March, it is also possible to visit the heronries at Godikwe and Gcobega Lagoons. It is also possible to do guided walks year-round. An area is chosen at the guide's discretion and in keeping with safe distances from large herds of elephant and buffalo. The distance and area for each walk may vary seasonally at the guides' discretion

ACCESS

Due to the remote location, Kwara is only accessible by light aircraft. The approximate 30 minute flight from Maun allows for you fly over the Okavango Delta and experience the intricate waterways and floodplains from bird-eye level. This adds so much to your experience, as you start and end the in the same way - with a great view.
